#### **ABSTRACT (All main headings Font size 12 Bold All Caps)**

**Do not keep headings in Abstract.**

**The abstract should be informative and completely self-explanatory, briefly present the topic.**

**State the scope of the experiments, indicate significant data, and point out major findings and conclusions.**

**The abstract should summarize the manuscript content in 300 words or less.**

**Standard nomenclature should be used and abbreviations should be avoided.**

**The preferable format should accommodate a description of the study background, methods, results and conclusion.**

**It should summarize the study with respect to selection of topic, methodology, observation, result and discussion.**

**You can use this document as both an instruction set and as a template into which you can type your own text. This document gives formatting instructions for authors preparing papers for publication.**

**3-10 keywords words and abbreviations should be included.**

**All keywords should be separated by comma,**

**Preferable keywords should be arranged in alphabetical manner**

### **1. INTRODUCTION**

**Do not use numbers/semicolon/colons or underline.**

**Clearly state the purpose of the article.**

**Summarize the study or observations.**

**Give only strictly relevant references**

**1 or 2 (References in superscript without brackets, numerical way**

**(In Vancouver style).**

### **2. MATERIALS AND METHODS**

**Materials (Subheadings Title case Font 12 Bold)**

**This section should provide a complete overview of the design of the study.**

**Detailed descriptions of materials or participants, comparisons, interventions and types of analysis should be mentioned.**

**However, only new procedures should be described in detail.**

**Previously published procedures should be cited and important modifications of published procedures should be mentioned briefly.**

**Capitalize trade names and include the manufacturer's name and address.**

### **3. OBSERVATIONS AND RESULTS**

**Present your results in logical sequence in the text, tables, and illustrations**

**The result must be precise and comprehensive and should not experience the ambiguity.**

**Negative results should not be manipulated or hidden.**

### **4. DISCUSSION**

**Discussion is the nucleus of any manuscript. So it should be encompassed with critical review of the results of the study with the support of relevant literature.**

**The Discussion should provide an interpretation of the results and their significance with regard to previously published work.**

**There should not be any significant repetition of the experimental procedures or replication of the introduction.**

### **5. CONCLUSION:**

**The principal conclusions drawn from the results and their important implications should be discussed.**

**Do not repeat in detail data already stated in the results. Based on scientific discussions, appropriate conclusions related to the present subject to be made.**

**Deviated conclusions or vague / general conclusions should not be made.**

### **6. ACKNOWLEDGEMENT:**

**This section includes acknowledgment of people, grant details, funds, etc.**

**Note: If an author fails to submit his/her work as per the above instructions, they are pleased to maintain clear titles namely headings, subheading.**

## 7. REFERENCES:

Only published or accepted manuscripts should be included in the reference list. Meetings abstracts, conference talks, or papers that have been submitted but not yet accepted should not be cited.

All personal communications should be supported by a letter from the relevant authors

Vancouver style reference should be maintained and numbered consecutively in the order in which they are first mentioned in the text (not in alphabetic order).

Identify references in text, tables, and legends by numerals in superscript.

References cited only in tables or figure legends should be numbered in accordance with the sequence established by the first identification in the text of the particular table or figure.

Avoid using abstracts in souvenir as references and do not cite any references in discussion and conclusion section.

The total number of references shall not exceed more than 25.
